


Wood Stains on Fabric are Permanent

My husband just inherited a quilt made by his Mom, back in the early '60s I think. She stored it in a cedar chest and of course there are bad cedar oil stains where the folds touched the sides. Fortunately they are on the back of the quilt. Will anything remove those stains? Someone suggested Orvus soap but haven't tried it yet. Will it work? Sue Jones

Hi Sue, I'm sorry. Wish I had better news for you, but wood resin stains are permanent. I have not heard of anything that will take them out. Orvus is great for washing quilts, but unfortunately, it won't remove these stains. You still have a treasure, so just love and enjoy your quilt. Katie

Just a reminder to all - please make sure your quilts are not in, on or touching untreated wood. Once wood resins are absorbed, they leave a permanent stain.

Cut the following:

Light Fabric:

*Cut 4 rectangles - 6½" x 3½"

*Cut 2 squares - 3½" x 3½"

*Cut I square - 31/8" x 31/8"

Dark Fabric

*Cut 1 square - $6\frac{1}{2}$ " x $6\frac{1}{2}$ "

*Cut 4 squares - 3½" x 3½"

*Cut 1 square - 31/8" x 31/8"


Make two half-square triangles by layering the light 3%" x 3%" square and the dark 3%" x 3%" square, right sides together.

Draw a diagonal line from corner to corner and sew 1/4" on each side of the line. Cut between the stitching lines on the drawn line. Press the seams toward the dark fabric. The half-square triangles should measure $3\frac{1}{2}$ ".

Place a dark $3\frac{1}{2}$ " square on the right end of a light $6\frac{1}{2}$ " x $3\frac{1}{2}$ " rectangle. Draw a diagonal line across the dark square. (See diagram A) Stitch on the line. Trim the excess and press. Make two of these.

Place a dark $3\frac{1}{2}$ " square on the left end of a light $6\frac{1}{2}$ " x $3\frac{1}{2}$ " rectangle. Draw a diagonal line across the dark square. (See diagram B) Stitch on the line. Trim the excess and press. Make two of these.


Follow the block diagram to arrange the half-square triangles, pieced rectangles, light squares and $6\frac{1}{2}$ " square to finish piecing the block. Your block should measure $12\frac{1}{2}$ ".


