December 13: Karen Malone will present class projects and new ideas from "All About Quilts".

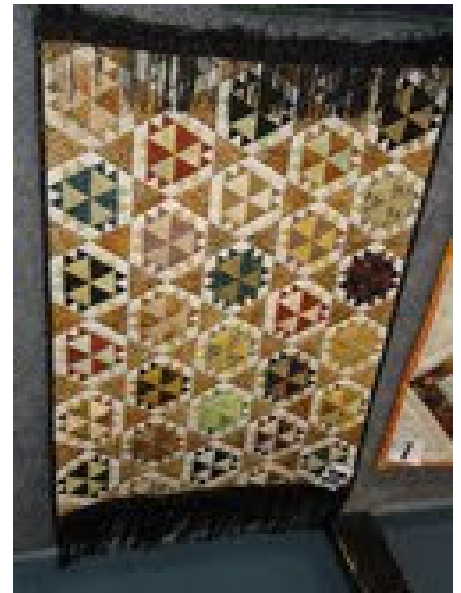
We will also have our annual Christmas gift exchange, and a potluck Christmas brunch. Please bring recipes for the food you bring.

Block of the Month 2010

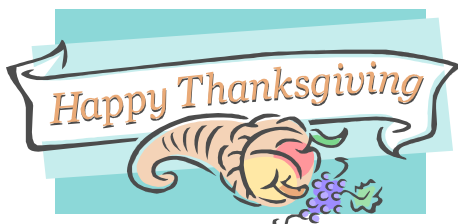

President's Quilt for Rachel: Buckeye Beauty

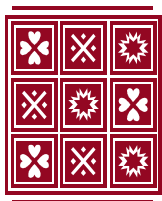
It is a simple 12 inch block. Each block needs six different fall colored calicoes and two different cream/tans. It is made up of 4 smaller blocks. 2 of the blocks are half-square triangle blocks and two are 4 patch blocks. If you are unfamiliar with the block, you can see an example at:
