**Every Thursday** from 11 am-3 pm a group meets at the Riley County Senior Center to sew, quilt and visit.

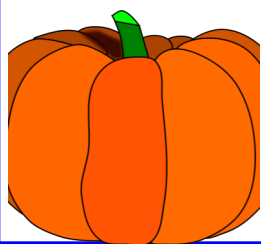


